Women graduate students from Cornell University founded SDE/GWIS (often referred to as GWIS) in 1921. Currently there are 14 active chapters throughout the United States and members who do not live in the vicinity of a city or university chapter can be affiliated with Omega chapter. Members from Canada and other countries are also included in Omega's membership.

MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

If you hold a baccalaureate degree or higher in a scientific discipline in which the scientific method is used and have some research experience, you are invited to join. Many of our members hold masters and doctoral degrees. Graduate students and postdoctoral fellows, in particular, can benefit from the advice and networking that GWIS can offer during this formative stage of their careers.
